## SENIOR CORNER: A CALL TO ACTION by Rodger Zeller

Many of you at Bethany are grandparents. You find a lot of satisfaction in being a grandparent. It's more fun than being a parent. You love your grandchildren and want the best for them.

I would like to encourage you to be proactively involved in their lives especially in the area of modeling Christian faith and Christian values. Your grandchildren are growing up in a culture that is increasingly anti-Christian.

Your grandchildren are being bombarded with an overload of sex and violence. Our culture is reinforcing the concept that morality is relative and there is no such thing as absolute truth. Popular culture is getting to be more crude, coarse, and vulgar. Both TV and the movies are aggressively "pushing the envelope". TV shows are also using more and more vulgar language. Their aim is to be able to say anything they want. You might want to encourage your grandchildren to resist the negative forces in the popular culture. This would probably be especially true if your grandchildren are teen-agers.

When I was growing up, there was not much of a conflict between the values of society and the values I was being taught. I was not faced with conflicts between my faith and the values in the culture. The culture was steeped in Judeo-Christian values. As grandparents we need to show our grandkids that these values are worth passing on.

As grandparents we need to be boldly defending our Christian values. Popular culture is telling us that we have become passé. So what if there is a lack of morality? Being moral means you are a fuddy-duddy. So what if the family is falling apart? We'll just redefine the family. So what if the foundations of our society are cracking. Grandparents can make a difference. It is up to us to be a model of a committed Christian to our grandchildren. We have some good values to pass on to our grandkids. I trust you are demonstrating your faith to your grandkids to help establish their path through life.





## BETHANY BOOK CLUB by Louise Aebersold

Intrigued by true stories filled with excitement, drama and a touch of mystery? Then, Anatomy of a Murder by Robert Traver is for you. Robert Traver was the pen name of John D. Voelker, a Michigan Supreme Court Justice. He wrote Anatomy of a Murder based on a 1952 murder case. It was America's original #1 bestselling legal thriller and courtroom drama and the basis for the classic Oscar Award-nominated 1959 film starring Jimmy Stewart.

In this novel Paul Biegler is a lawyer who was formerly the prosecuting attorney. He takes on the case of an army lieutenant named Frederic Manion who has been charged with shooting a bartender who his wife said raped her. Manion returns to the park after the murder and gives his gun to the park attendant and waits for the police. Several witnesses saw the event with their own eyes and can testify that Manion committed the ruthless, cold-blooded act. The problem is: how do you defend a man who commits a murder in front of a bar full of witnesses and then admits he did it to the police? Biegler's challenge is to find a legal justification for the killing, all the while balancing the intense emotions that come along with murder against the consciences and sympathies of the twelve strangers in the jury box. The lawyer sees it as a straightforward, albeit gravely difficult, legal challenge, until he starts to dig beneath the surface of the crime and finds that some startling facts have not yet come to light, and that the truth of the situation is far more complex than he could have imagined....

Our November discussion of this book will be **November 18<sup>th</sup>** at 9:15 AM at Louise Aebersold's home. There should be some interesting comparisons between Anatomy of a Murder and last month's book, The Innocent Man – both based on true stories involving some stumbles of "blind justice". For those who are interested, we will have a time to view the movie. It can be fun to compare the actual book with the movie version.

## BIG NEWS!

On Sunday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, we saw a skit (written by Dave von Behren) about our shortfall in fundraising this fiscal year. The skit enumerated all the little fundraisers we were going to have to do to gain ground in our income for the 2011 fiscal year. HOWEVER, the Stewardship Team promised **not** to do all the little fundraisers (which would involve hundreds of volunteer hours, by the way) if we would just raise the cash of a fundraiser without actually doing a fundraiser.

Then, we received spontaneous gifts from individual members of the congregation totaling \$2,000! We need \$3,000 to reach our goal and Jon McGregor is hoping for a total of \$4,000 to make up for our shortfall in fundraising projects. We are calling this effort the NO-FUNDRAISER FUNDRAISER! If we raise the additional thousand dollars for our church budget, we will NOT have to do any more fundraisers for 2011 to support the church budget. Better, if we raise \$4,000 total, we will significantly close our deficit gap of \$11,000.

## YOUTH GROUP MERRIMENT by Michelle McGregor

It's 6:52 PM on Wednesday. Mackenna, Daphne, Faith and Callie arrive early, unable to wait to begin their evening. I open the doors at 6:59 and relish their enthusiasm as they tumble in to find their spot at the tables; what began as 1 table two years ago, has now grown into 3 tables that are overflowing!

We begin our evening with dessert and animated conversation. Eventually I begin the challenging task of gaining their attention to go over announcements. The veterans quiet instantly, the rookies take a bit longer. That's ok, I patiently wait for them to catch on. We move onto a fun game called Open Mic where I display a single word on the TV screen. It's "baby," and Connie jumps up and begins to sing Justin Bieber's "Baby" song. That's the point, to be the first to stand and sing a song with the word in it. I toss her a candy reward. This continues for several hilarious minutes. What's the point? Fun! Don't worry, the serious stuff is coming.... But not yet.

First we must play an interesting game called "Homemade Lemonade." Two teams line up. On go, they run to the first station and pour a spoonful of sugar in their mouth, holding it there, they proceed to the lemon stations where they squeeze lemon juice into their mouths, still holding it there they move to the water station and pour a small cup full of water into their mouths. With all this in their full mouths, they must perform 10 jumping jacks to "mix" the lemonade. As their final chore, they run to the last station and spit the "lemonade" into the empty pitcher. This continues until I yell "stop." Team 2 wins by a long shot! Congrats guys! Let's drink! Just kidding, I proceed to bring out lemonade I mixed ahead of time. A few kids don't want to drink it.... Hmmmm. Now we begin the serious stuff.

It takes me a few minutes to wait for their blood pressure to lower and the sugar to stop the twitching, but eventually I get their attention with an opening song, "I Lift My Hands," by Chris Tomlin. I pass out the lyrics as I play the song,

"Be still, there is a healer  
His love is deeper than the sea  
His mercy, it is unfailing  
His arms are fortress for the weak  
Let faith arise  
Let faith arise  
I lift my hands to believe again  
You are my refuge, You are my strength  
As I pour out my heart  
These things, I remember  
You are faithful, God, forever"



We begin our lesson. I open with a question: "Have you ever posted FML on Facebook?" It gets most of their attention. FML is a new term being used meaning (the clean version) Forget My Life. I see this posted quite a bit when the youth are overwhelmed with a difficult time or situation.

Several raise their hands and a few even share what was going on at the time. I encourage them to share because we want to support them but also to let the others know they aren't alone. We all have tough times.

I show them a clip from the movie, Forrest Gump. It's the scene where Lieutenant Dan straps himself to the shrimp boat during a bad storm, challenging God to show him why he should go on living despite his life not turning out the way he planned. The scene finishes with the storm ending and Forrest and Dan going on to become very successful, rich men.

God doesn't always rescue us, I say. Sometimes, he walks beside us. Sometimes he carries us when we are too weak to walk. And always, always, He takes our storms and shows us a rainbow. The storms aren't easy to endure, often overwhelming but we are never alone, never misunderstood and can turn to God for a never ending supply of comfort and strength.

It's 8:50: I reach for my Prayer Notebook. I turn to last week's prayer requests and follow up with the youth on them. I turn the page and together we add our prayers, petitions and thanksgivings.

Father, I thank you for these young people who love you so much that they find time to be here each and every Wednesday to grow closer to you and each other. To continue to seek your will and direction in their lives. I ask that you be with them this week at home, at school and wherever their life takes them. Help them with their studies, guide them in their relationships and continue to make them aware of your presence every second. Thank you for your comfort and strength during the storms in our lives. And, finally, continue to show us how to be blessings to all those we encounter. Amen.
